ENGLISH

We will begin the year by studying two treasure themed books: How to find Gold and On Sudden Hill. The children will use drama to explore the stories and characters and will then have the opportunity to use their imagination and their phonics to create writing of their own. We will be looking at narrative writing, developing and designing characters and writing in role as characters.

Phonic sessions will happen daily and all children will be split into their respective year groups. In year 1, children will be encouraged to spell words phonetically or use known spelling rules. In year 2, children will be learning and applying further grammatical rules. During Term 1, there will also be a focus on handwriting and forming all letters correctly.

PROJECT: What makes something treasure?

During Terms 1 and 2, we are undertaking two big history projects: Pirates and The Great Fire of London. During Term 1, we will be looking at famous pirates from the past, following and reading treasure maps to find treasure in our local environement, debating myths vs facts, looking at simple historical sources and beginning to analyse them.

In Term 2, we will progress to thinking about more abstract treasures such as family members, memories, and special places alongside studying the historical events and famouse people involved in The Great Fire of London.

ART and DT

In Term 1 we will be focussing on skills related to painting, for example, colour mixing, learning about primary and secondary colours, adding texture and mixed media to create different effects. In Term 2 the focus will be collage and we will be exploring and developing our skills.

P.E.

In PE this term, we will be focussing on developing movement and coordination. We will be exploring multi-skills activities to develop balance, spatial awareness, agility and coordination. The children will also have a weekly football session with Sports Cool. The children come to school in their P.E kits on Tuesdays and Thursdays.

MATHS

We will be focussing on Place Value during Term One. Year Ones will be revisiting numbers to 10 and ensuring confidence at comparing numbers, representing numbers in a variety of ways, counting forwards, backwards and ordering non-consecutive numbers. Year Two will be working on similar focusses but building to numbers to 100. There will be a focus on ensuring children use precise mathematical vocabulary and are confident using and responding to vocabulary such as greater than, less than, equal to, fewer than and more than. We will then be learning about addition and subtraction, using the part-whole models to help us represent and solve addition and subtraction problems.

SCIENCE

In Science the children will be learning 'all about animals'. The children will be learning to identify and name a variety of common animals including, fish, amphibians, reptiles, birds and mammals. The children shall be describing and comparing the structure of animals and how their diets differ.

P.S.H.E

Our PSHE focus this term is 'Being me in my world'. The children will explore the idea of belonging. They will work together as a class to decide on their class agreement and will talk about what it means to belong to the class community. We will discuss ways that the children can help each to other learn and we will talk about when and where they feel 'safe and special.' We will also be discussing what it means to feel proud.

R.E

During Term 1, we will be thinking about what it means to belong to faith community. The children will be introduced to simple stories and ideas from Christianity, Islam and Judaism. As we approach December, we will look at the Nativity story and focussing on our popular KS1 Nativity performance ©
